

The Dreidel Game

- Use small objects such as peanuts, pennies, or chocolate coins to play. Give every player the same number of objects to start.
- 2) Players take turns spinning the dreidel. Each player puts one object in the center each time a player spins the dreidel. When the dreidel stops, the letter that is showing on the top side of the dreidel (see below) tells the player what to do.
- 3) The dreidel game ends when one player wins all the objects.

What Each Hebrew Letter Means



Hey means you take half of the pile of objects from the center of the table.

Gimmel means you take the entire pile from the center of the table.

Shin means you must add one of your objects to the pile in the center.
